


Israel's been

an almond tree.




That means I'm

What do you see?


I see a pot of boiling

the North.




That is from where

a rock.




What do you see?

rot.




That's because they


What do you see?

What do you see?


Figs: some good,

too rotten to eat.




The rotten figs are

do think!





